An emergency is when you or somebody else needs help from a police officer, firefighter, or paramedic right away!

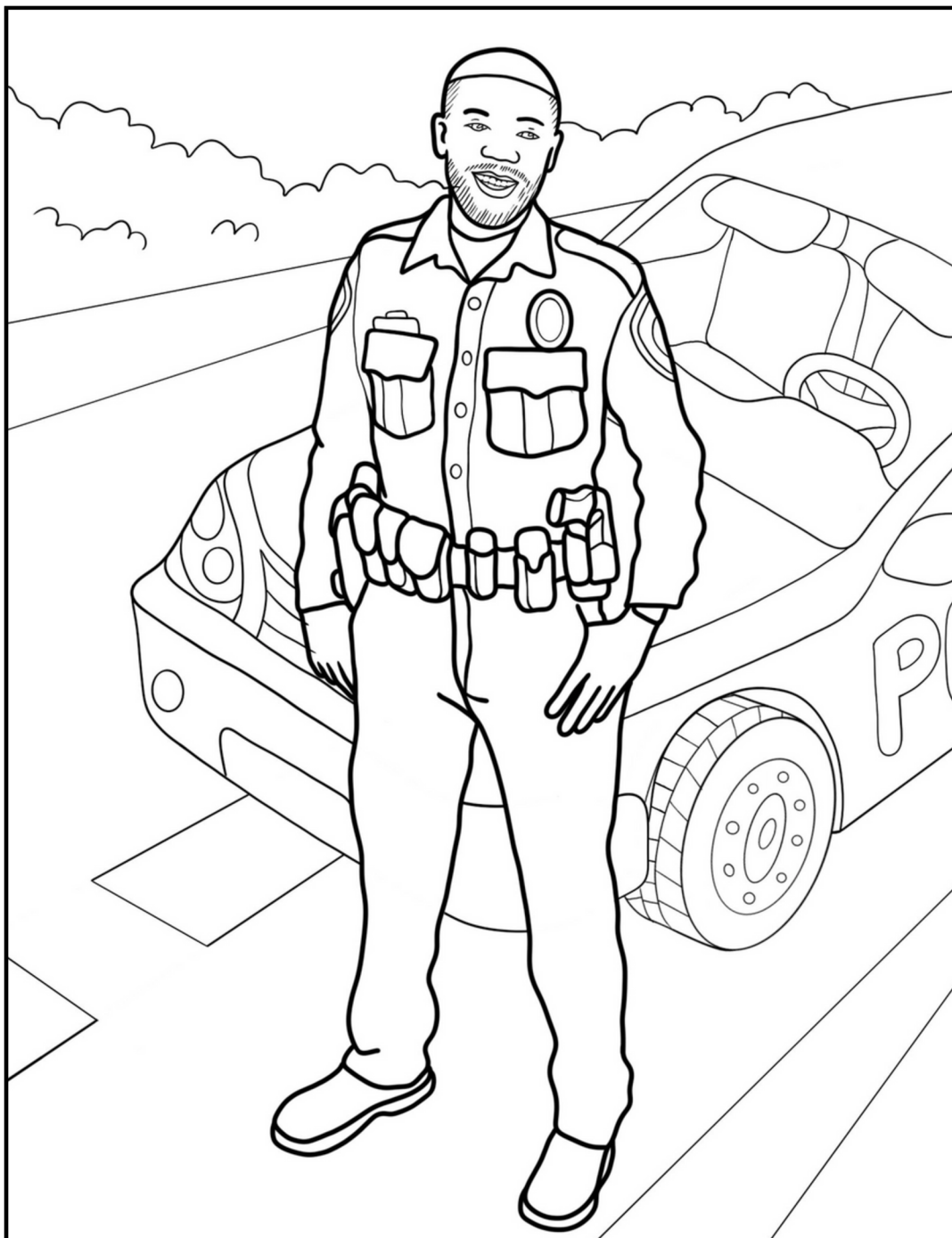

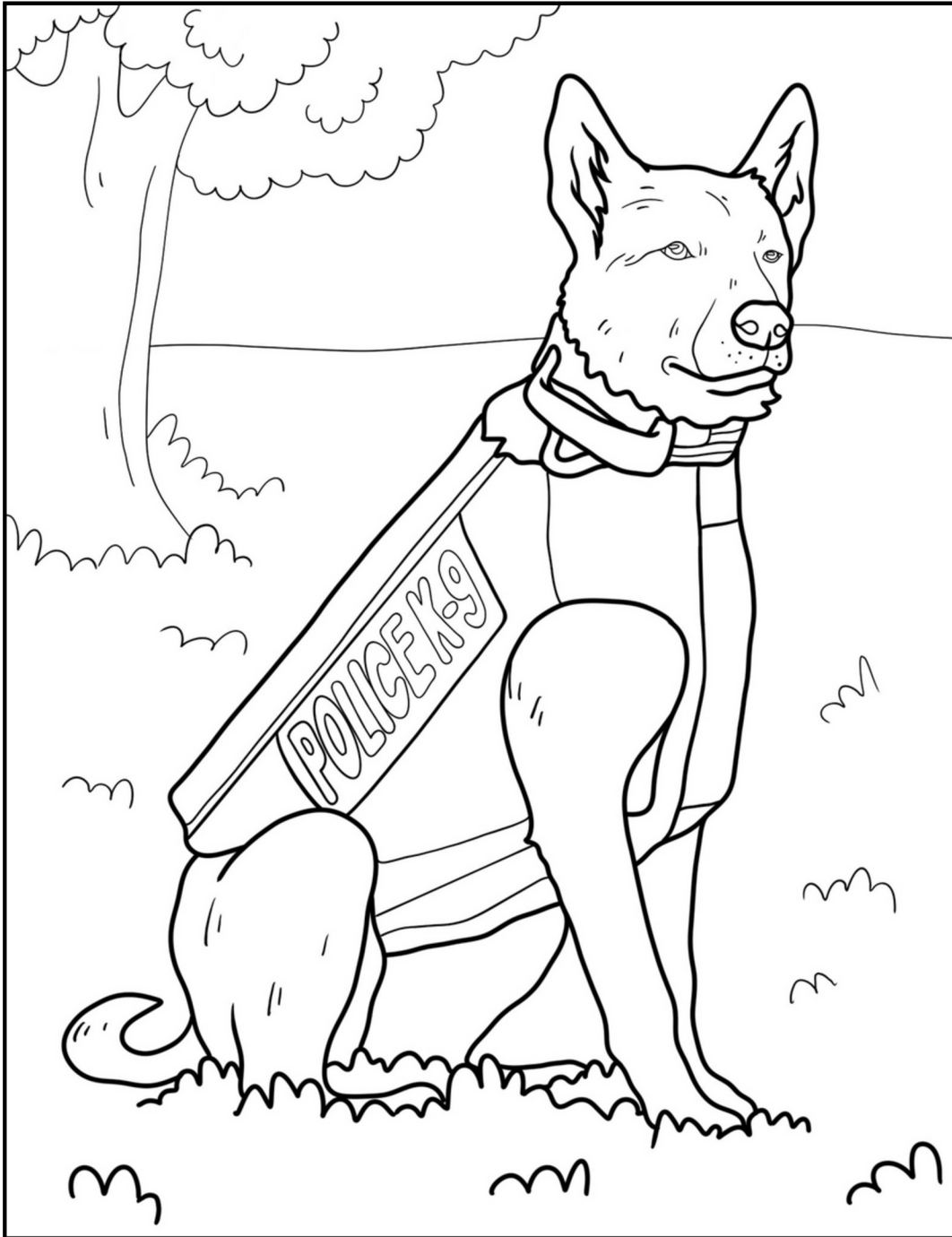

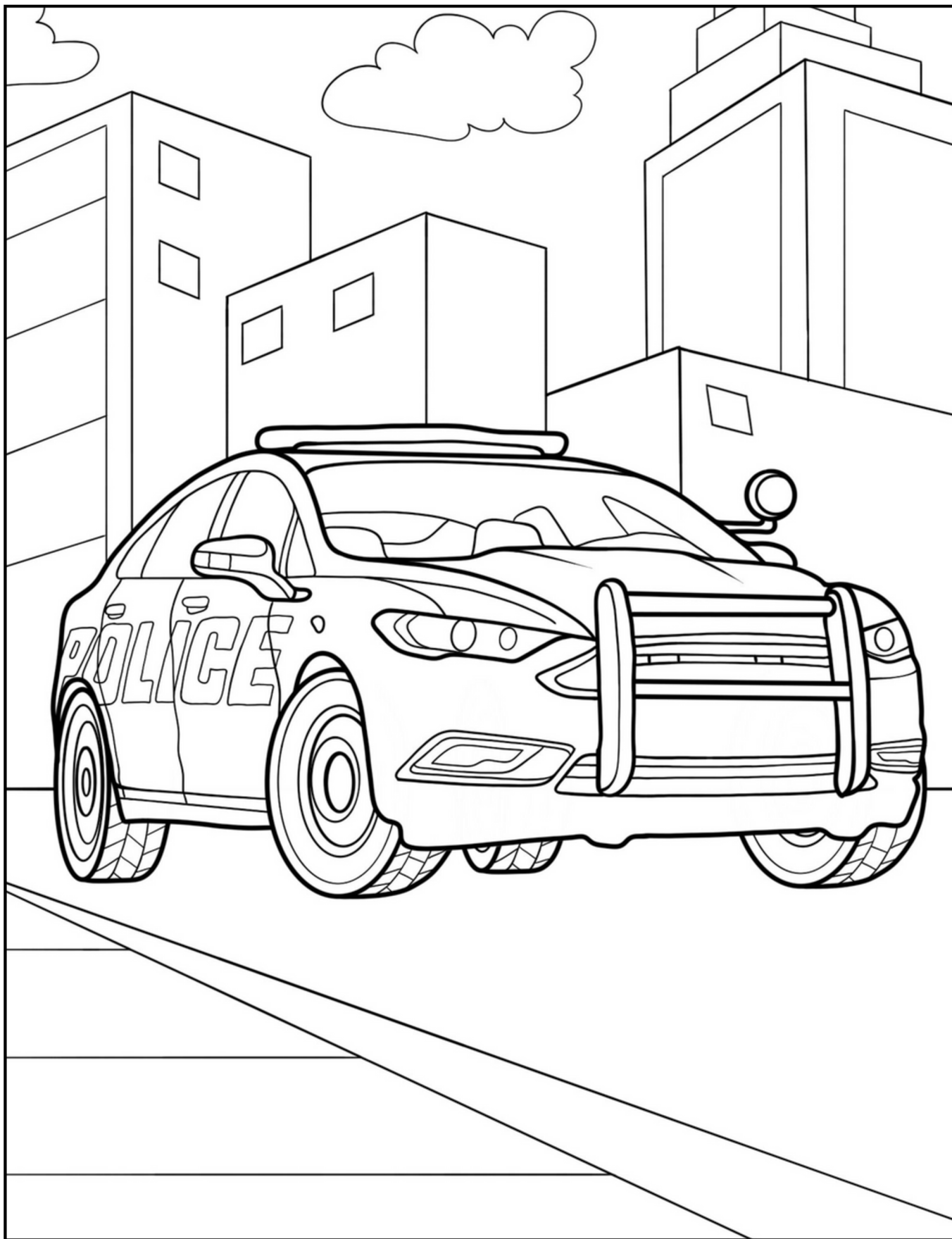

How do police dogs help police officers?



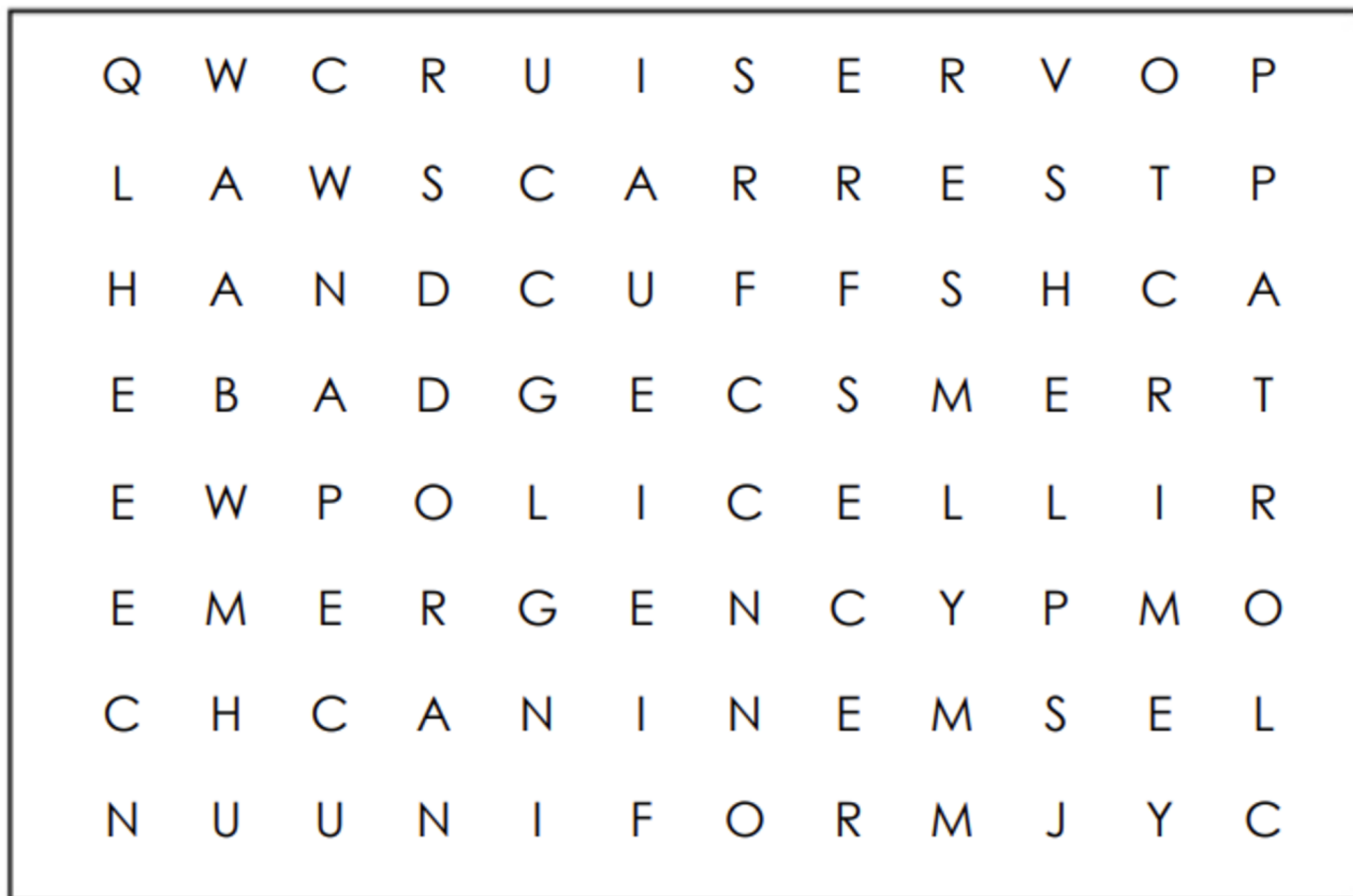
Sometimes police officers drive police cars, but they also drive trucks, SUVs, motorcycles, four-wheelers, and even bicycles!

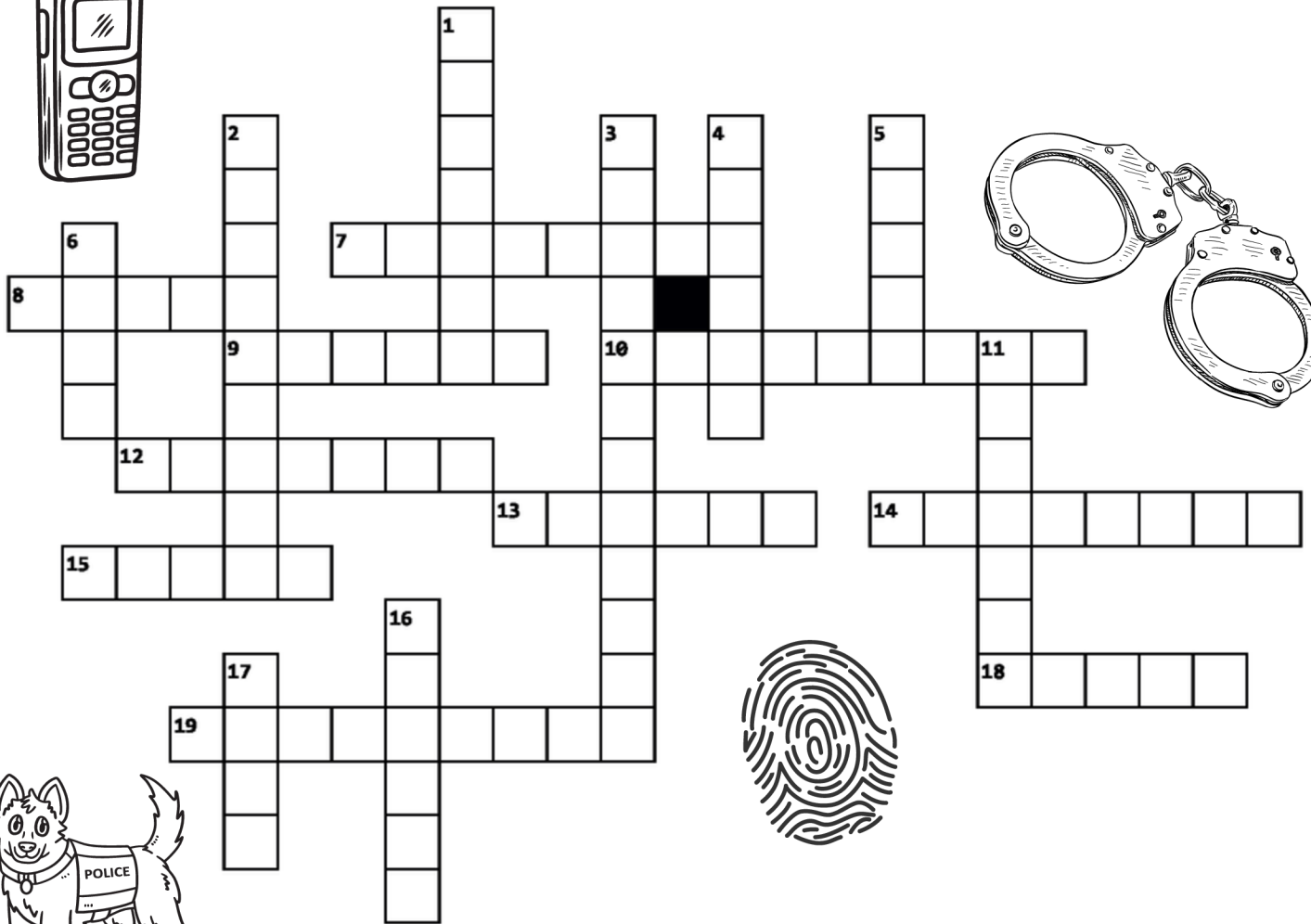
