### What this Criminal Record Check will include:

#### The Criminal Record Check (CRC) will include the following information as it exists on the date of the search:

- Criminal convictions from the Canadian Police Information Centre "CPIC" and/or local databases and summary convictions for the past five (5) years, when identified.
- Youth Criminal Justice Act findings of guilt will be released on applications to government institutions/organizations <u>only.</u>

The Criminal Record and Judicial Matters Check (CRJMC) will include all of the above and the following information as it exists on the date of the search:

- Outstanding entries such as charges and warrants, judicial orders, peace bonds, Probation and Prohibition Orders

   as per CPIC policy, information obtained from the investigative databank must be confirmed and authorized for release by the contributing agency.
- Absolute and conditional discharges within the applicable retention period.

Due to the nature of the Criminal Records Act and the RCMP's rules governing this, <u>only one (1) posiiton and only one (1)</u> <u>Employer/Organization</u> requesting this type of check can be listed on your Police Vulnerable Sector Check (VSC). If you require a Vulnerable Sector Check (VSC) for more than one (1) position/employer/organization requesting this check, you must submit <u>separate applications</u> and pay the necessary fees.

## The Vulnerable Sector Check (VSC) will include all of the above and the following information as it exists on the date of the search:

- In very exceptional cases, where it meets the Public Safety Test, non-conviction dispositions including but not limited to, Withdrawn and Dismissed.
- Not Criminally Responsible by Reason of Mental Disorder.
- All record suspensions (pardons) for release by the Minister of Public Safety as they relate to any sexual offences that are listed in the schedule to the Criminal Records Act.

# The Vulnerable Sector with Broad Record Check (if required and permitted under the CYFSA/IAA) will include all of the above and the following information as it exists on the date of the search:

- A. Outstanding restraining orders made against the applicant under the Children's Reform Act (s.35) or the Child, Youth and Family Services Act (s. 137 & s.279.3).
- B. Every contact between the applicant and the Sault Ste. Marie Police Service for which there is a written record, subject to MFIPPA.
- C. Every contact betweent the applicant and the Sault Ste. Marie Police Service in relation to actions taken against the applicant under the Mental Health Act.

When an applicant is applying for a Vulnerable Sector Check (with or without a Broad Record Check), the Sault Ste. Marie Police Service may require a "job description" to be submitted with their application, whether for employment or a volunteer opportunity, outlining their "direct care and control of a vulnerable person" which satisfies the requirement for a Vulnerable Sector Check / Broad Record Check within the description of a vulnerable person in Ontario's Bill 113, the Police Record Check Reform Act, and the Criminal Records Act.

\_\_\_\_\_Persons requiring record checks for the purposes of **Adoption** are to request a Criminal Records and Judicial Matters Check. (This may be subject to change after January 1, 2025.)

\_\_\_\_\_Persons requiring record checks for the purposes of **Kinship** are to request a Vulnerable Sector Check. (This may be subject to change after January 1, 2025.)

\_\_\_\_\_Persons requiring a **Non-Parent Custody Applicant Record Check** (through Court Order) <u>cannot</u> use the online screening process.
