

Online Sex Assault Reporting

If this is an emergency, DO NOT file an Online Report, 911 immediately

To make the process of reporting a sexual assault easier, the Sault Ste. Marie Police Service has an online reporting option available for victims of sexual assault. Our goal is to investigate all allegations of sexual assault in a coordinated, effective manner ensuring the victim receives proper support and to ultimately identify, arrest and prosecute the person(s) responsible.

You SHOULD NOT file an online sexual assault report if:

- This is an emergency.
- You are in danger or need medical assistance.
- This just happened or the suspect is nearby.
- You are also the victim of Partner Assault.

If any of the above statements apply to you, call 911.

To file your report online, we require the following.

- You must have a valid email address; it should be a confidential email and not accessible by the individual who assaulted you.
- The report needs to be reported by the survivor, if you are a young person the parent/guardian must fill in the report.
- The report must be completed in its entirety, including address and contact information.

Once the report is completed, you will:

- Be given a temporary police report number.
- Be able to print your report.

Please note the following when filing a Sexual Assault report online:

- All online sex assault reports will be reviewed within 72 hours.
- You will receive a notification when the report has been reviewed
- Once the report is reviewed a police officer will contact you.
